CSG Solar wins a 2006 World Technology Award

On Friday, 3rd November 2006 in San Francisco, USA, German solar energy company CSG Solar won the World Technology Award 2006 for Innovations in Energy.

David Hogg (CEO) CSG Solar said after the award was announced: "We are delighted that our efforts to develop the next generation of solar technology have been recognised by leaders in the field of energy technology and to receive a 2006 World Technology Award".

CSG Solar shared the winner's podium with Google (in IT und Software Development), Al Gore (in Technology Policy) YouTube (in Entertainment Technology), and IBM (in Materials Technology).

The development of CSG's technology started in 1995 in Sydney, Australia with the objective of bringing a new product to the market and changing the shape of the solar industry.
